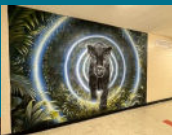
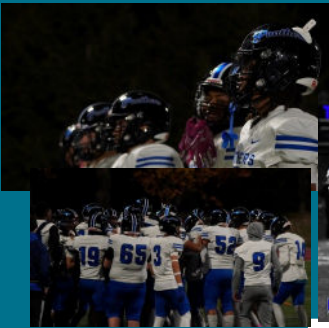

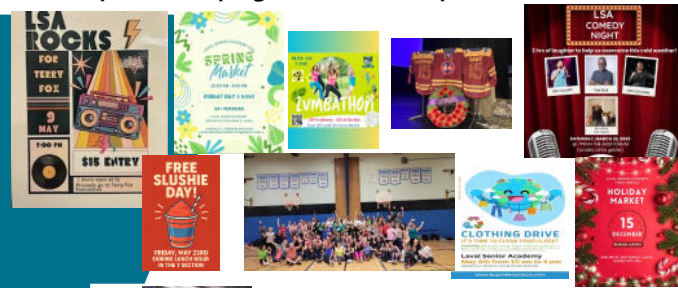

INTRODUCING LAVAL SENIOR ACADEMY 2024-25

MISSION AND VISION

Laval Senior Academy (LSA) provides a solid educational foundation to achieve both academic and personal growth. Our goal is to develop responsible citizens and life-long learners. Through a committed partnership between students, staff and community, we are dedicated to upholding diversity and mutual respect.

Laval Senior Academy is a school where all active members work together, to fulfill potential growth by teaching through engagement. We value respect and strongly believe in integrity, identity, choice, and personal responsibility. Our educational programs form the basis for a comprehensive and individualized education, which prepares students for post-secondary studies. LSA is an inclusive school offering equal opportunity, which embraces diversity and acceptance for all.

PROGRAMS

This year LSA welcomed 1284 students. LSA offers a well-defined, disciplined structure to ensure an environment conducive to learning. Many opportunities are provided for students to excel in academics, arts, and athletics. In recent years, economic and educational organizations have identified the need to offer senior high school students more diversified educational options. To this end, the Secondary Cycle Two curriculum offers different options and courses, including a choice between three Learning Paths: A **General Education** path, an **Applied General Education** path, and a **Work-Oriented Training** path consisting of two learning options.

Building on the **General** and **Applied General Education** paths, LSA offers concentrations in visual arts, science, and sports, as well as several Sport-Études opportunities and the Blue & Gold Hockey program. LSA's dedicated school

staff strives to recognize student success in ways that build self-esteem and school pride. Staff work diligently to support the education of the whole child which includes extracurricular as well as academic activities. Teaching staff also provide remediation support and exam preparatory sessions during the end-of-year exam period. Students who require additional support have access to special education technicians, attendants, resource support teachers, and the Guidance Department.

The **Work-Oriented Training** path (WOTP) is an alternative to the traditional, academic General Education path students who enroll in WOTP often find that the smaller class size and personal focus offers them the opportunity to achieve success and enjoy learning in ways that previously did not seem possible for them. This path is offered in work-study and may lead directly to the job market.

STUDENT LIFE AND LEARNING

Over 50 extracurricular activities were available for students to join, offered at no cost to students during lunch and after school, including Sports Intramurals, Yearbook Committee, Games Room, Oasis Lounge, Art Club, Grad Committee, Student Council, Fitness Room, Science Fair, Robotics, and much more. The **Student Council** also brought forth an incredible effort in various fund raising and activities to improve student life and student moral. Speaking of students, from an academic standpoint our students once again excelled in our science fair activity, and from a sports perspective many of our teams reached the finals often competing toe-to-toe with private institutions with professionalism and elan.

Many LSA students gave their time generously to organize charity events this year, such as those for Pink in the City, We are also proud of LSA's dedicated staff who organized the second annual Terry Fox Fundraising Campaign, which featured fun and engaging in-school events throughout the year (Coin Wars, and more). The campaign concluded with the traditional Run for Terry Fox in April and a benefit LSA ROCKs Concert by LSA students and staff in May. Overall, the campaign raised just over \$8300 for the Terry Fox Foundation and was one of

the top 50 schools in Quebec!

ABAV PLAN

Each year, a school must adopt and implement an Anti-Bullying/Anti-Violence (ABAV) Plan. At LSA, the ABAV Plan is developed by a team of staff members using information gathered in a detailed survey which assesses the state of mind and current situation of students within the school (*Our School Survey*). Students are educated about bullying and its impacts through various activities which help to foster a feeling of safety and well-being.

GOVERNING BOARD ACTIVITIES

Laval Senior Academy has a profound history in our community. Our building was first built in 1962 and has since been the educational institution we now call Laval Senior Academy has produced some of the world's best athletes, musicians, and academics. It has contributed immensely in the betterment of our world. Amongst its graduates are Nicolas Macrozonaris (200-meter champion), William Rosenberg (first non-US lawyer to serve as Chair of the American Bar Association), Canadian football legend Gerry Dattilio, and also our current SWLSB Chair James Di Sano.

Amongst our activities for the 2024-2025 were geared towards approving several field trips, and approving of several fund-raising measures to empower our school to build a strong base in our community. This effort could not have been done without the hard work of our parent volunteers in the Parent Participation Organization (PPO).

The 2024-2025 school year was an exceptional year where despite great economic and social hardships in our community our school gave it is all and succeeded.
